Each year 12,000 flyers and over 300 posters are distributed to over 300 locations in a 25 mile radius of Prescot. An intensive media and internet campaign is also organised which, experience has shown, leads to excellent audience numbers at every event.

As you may be aware, we saw a record turnout for last year's concert series that featured choirs, orchestras and an unscheduled appearance from a *Britain's Got Talent* singing sensation. Over the 10 days, 1300 people came through the doors for the 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Prescot Festival.

The festival began on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June with a show-stopping concert by musical theatre company BOST – and a surprise appearance by Richard Johnson, who with brother, Adam came third in ITV's *Britain's Got Talent* last year. Just days after the impromptu performance, the Johnson Brothers announced a debut album deal with Sony. The programme continued throughout the week with a gospel choir, a cathedral organist, school instrumental and verse-speaking competitions, and a full symphony orchestra playing Elgar's *Cello Concerto* with Royal Liverpool Philharmonic soloist Gethyn Jones. In another festival record, 100 sopranos, altos,

tenors and basses gathered from across the North West to join the Prescot Festival Chorus in singing Fauré's *Requiem*. It was left to Haydock Male Voice Choir to round off the proceedings on Sunday night with the Proms-style Festival Finale in a packed Prescot Parish Church.

Since then the Artistic Director and the Friends of the Festival have been working hard to schedule an amazing 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Prescot Festival which will once again be **accessible** to everyone, **affordable** in difficult economic times and **all-encompassing**, with all kinds of arts, music and entertainment on offer.

The 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Prescot Festival of Music and the Arts will be a special celebration and will open with 100 years of Classic Light Music by the Phoenix Concert Orchestra. The first weekend will then proceed with a choral spectacular with a Come & Sing chorus – Prescot Festival Chorus performing Handel's *Messiah* – and several local community choirs, as well as an organ recital by Festival Patron Prof. Dr. Ian Tracey, Organist to the City of Liverpool and Organist Titulaire at Liverpool's Anglican Cathedral.

The Festival week-nights will feature a Schools' Verse Speaking Festival, a poetry evening at Poco Coffee, Young Instrumentalist of Prescot competition and a dinner with jazz evening featuring a three-course dinner and entertainment from Dr Jazz and the Cheshire Cats. The second Festival weekend will begin with songs from the shows from the multi-award winning Centenary Theatre Company on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> June. The weekend will continue with our 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala Concert which will feature Foden's Brass Band, adopting a "Brassed Off" theme, and also includes a complementary buffet. The weekend will then be brought to a climax with choral evensong in Prescot Parish Church and a Last Night of the Proms style concert with Maghull Wind Orchestra.
